

LOZ THE STATS MAN

The domestic cricket season has arrived and unfortunately for the first Shield game it's been a case of the same old Redbacks, as they have gone down in three days to Tasmania at Rolton Oval in Adelaide.

The top order just didn't fire as they were 4-49 on the first morning and 3-10 at the start of the second innings, which was nowhere near good enough. Skipper Jake Lehmann (115) made one of his best hundreds and had not Ben Manenti (71) and Wes Agar (23) stood up, SA wouldn't have got anywhere near the 307 they ended up with in the first dig.

Early on the bowling early was not up to standard, as Tasmania reached 1-211, but after a bake at lunch on day two from the coach Jason Gillespie, the lads re-

sponded to take the next 9-160, with Jordan Buckingham outstanding taking 7-71, his last five wickets either bowled or LBW. This young quick continues to improve by the game and looks destined to get higher honours in the not too distant future.

SA were just 74 behind and still in the game, but the second innings batting let the side down and it is a real worry ahead of the rest of summer. Tassie bowled and caught superbly to win the game with a day to spare and show they could be a real improver this season.

Suddenly on the back of a poor batting effort from the top six, players are under more pressure. Henry Hunt who averaged just 25 last season, is now under the pump after scoring just 16 and 2. Questions again remain about Kelvin Smith (21 & 4) at 29 years of age and a career average of just 20. Daniel Drew made a great one day ton in Brisbane, but bowlers are putting more work into his weaknesses and he failed with scores of just 6 and 1.

Victorian recruit Jake Fraser-McGurk made 37 & 29 on debut and showed he has all the shots, but got out both times when set and quickly needs to find a way to convert starts. **Ben Manenti (71 & 28*) made runs but I wonder if he is good enough to be in the team as a front line spinner.**

The team has a one-dayer against Tassie on Sunday, and then a week later back up against in a Shield game at Adelaide Oval against New South Wales. Improvement is needed and fast if the Redbacks are going to win games this season.

The World Cup has just got underway, I think three teams stand out, India, England and Australia, despite some iffy form in the lead up matches by the Aussies. The fourth semi-finalist could easily be one of Pakistan, Sri Lanka, New Zealand or South Africa. I do like the Saffas spinners, and they have some hard hitting batsmen. So I lean to them to just make the final spot for the semis.
