#### LOZ THE STATS MAN

At the ICC World Cup, Australia's chances of making the semis are hanging by a thread, as it takes on Pakistan tonight (Friday) in Bengaluru. After struggling in recent games it was pleasing to see Adam Zampa take 4-47 on Monday against Sri Lanka, to help reduce them from 0-125 to 209 all out. The batsmen did the job to get Australia home by five wickets, but it is a worry we have only two 50s (no 100s) in the three games so far. **Travis Head** is on his way to India for the second half of the tournament, it is hoped he

will be fit to play against New Zealand on Saturday week, October 28.

After a slow start, the tournament is starting to crank up, thanks to upset wins this week by Afghanistan over England and the Netherlands against South Africa. India and New Zealand clearly look the best two teams, and with both those sides four wins for four games, are almost certain to make the semis. With the above upsets it helps make Australia's chance of qualifying all the better, with six or maybe five wins maybe enough to get them in. Having said that, if they don't get over Pakistan tonight, it will almost be curtains for them.

The Redbacks are on the board after securing their first win of the Sheffield Shield season, where they beat New South Wales by 186 runs. Nathan McAndrew with match figures of 10-61 was excellent, while number four batsman Nathan McSweeney continues to improve, making 64 and 100 to claim Man of match honours on a pitch that favoured the bowlers. The catch was also very good, which has also been an issue for the team. The lads have a one-dayer today, so hopefully they can get their first of the season in that format as well. With the match being played on a Friday it seems stupid that it wasn't a day/night rather than a 10am start.

The real test will come next week when they play Western Australia in a four-day game starting Thursday. The boys from the West have won the last two Shields and have a lot of depth, so the match against them will be a rest test of where the Redbacks are at.
