Well just as Australia seemed to be getting its World Cup campaign back on track, Glenn Maxwell is concussed falling out of a golf cart and Mitch Marsh has to head home for personal reasons. Both have made decent contributions to the campaign and while Maxwell should be back soon, Marsh is a big loss for his firepower with the bat and odd overs with the ball. Marcus Stoinis should be right to return and I would give Sean Abbott a run rather than Cameron Green, just to get a game into him before a possible semi-final.

Australia has England on Saturday night, who have been going poorly. That's not to say they can't cause an upset. But with four wins on the trot, Australia will not be wanting any hiccups heading into a potential semi-final with South Africa or India.

It was great to see Travis Head smash the Kiwis all over Dharamsala on Saturday night, which helped set up the win. He didn't miss a trick and will most likely be called upon to bowl a few overs against the Poms, with Maxwell out.

If there is one worry it is the Aussie pace attack, which has been a bit inconsistent. Fortunately, Adam Zampa is back to nearly his best and attacking the stumps more, and the results have come his way.

In Shield Cricket, the Redbacks matched WA for two days last week at Adelaide Oval, before being soundly done by 200 runs just after tea on the final day. The batting continues to be a concern, with the side being four for spit most innings. Pacemen Nathan McAndrew and Wes Agar look set to miss the game through injury with Queensland which starts at the Gabba on Monday, but there are ample replacements with Brendan Doggett and Jordan Buckingham fit and ready to step back into the breach. But the batting is a problem, hopefully Jake Fraser-McGurk will be fit to go and can playing a dominant innings to get the SA boys Shield season back on track.
