

LOZ THE STATS MAN

The Aussies are through to the World Cup Final on Sunday after a hard fought three wicket win over South Africa at Eden Gardens overnight. The victory was set up with some brilliant new ball bowling from Josh Hazlewood and Mitchell Starc which saw the Saffas reduced to 4-24. The Aussies were also on fire in the field with David Warner and Marnus Labuschagne stopping everything to put the Proteas under massive pressure early on. To their credit South Africa recovered and at 4-111 were back in the game, but then with Adam Zampa not at his best, Travis Head was called up to bowl and struck in his first over, to dismiss Heinrich Klassen and Marco Jansen in consecutive balls to be on a hat-trick.

David Miller made a magnificent 101 as Saffas reached a respectable 212, which was going to be a tricky chase on a pitch that was really starting to take spin. The opener came out and smacked 60 off the first six overs, to take the scoreboard pressure out the game. Warner hammered four sixes in his 29 before being bowled while Travis Head belted 62 off 48 balls, but with his dismissal at 3-106 one felt it was far from over. A real battle for runs against the spinners developed, with Tabraiz Shamsi getting Marnus Labuschagne (18) and Glenn Maxwell (1), Australia then 5-137 as 213 looked a long way off.

Steve Smith (30) had things under control until he miscued one and Josh Inglis (28) found form at the right time, but when he was yorked, Australia still wanted 20 to win with just three wickets left. In some very tense cricket, every run had to be fought for as skipper Pat Cummins and Starc saw the team home with 16 balls to spare

Looking to Sunday's final and at the moment India have an invincibility like the West Indies of the 1980s and the Australians at the 2003 and 2007 World Cups. They hardly have a weakness and on their home surface will be very difficult to beat on Sunday night. Australia's big hope to knock them off would be to bat first and make 320 plus and hope to knock over their top order to set up a victory. The Aussies have won eight in a row and most of the victories have been scrappy, so they'll need to try and make it a street fight to win. If India bats first I fear it will be similar to the semi where the locals batted New Zealand out of the game.

But in a one-off game Australia has a big chance to knock them off, hopefully Starc and Hazlewood can repeat their brilliant new ball spells of the semi and one or two of the Aussies can fire big time with the bat to bring home a sixth World Cup title.

At the WACA after two days, WA is well placed to beat SA but haven't had it all their way. SA made just 192 but kept the bowlers did well to keep WA to just 204. SA's top order again failed to produce but thanks to some fight from Harry Nielsen (42*) lead by 107 with four wickets still to fall. On a tough surface to bat on, 26 wickets have fallen so far, so any sort of target over 180 could be defendable, but I don't like our chances.
