With Indian batsman Rohit Sharma about to take control of the 2023 World Cup Final having raced to 47 runs off 30 balls the writing was almost on the wall . But a miss timed shot off a Glen Maxwell delivery gave Travis Head just enough time to sight and track the ball over his shoulder before unleashing a great dive and more importantly holding one of the greatest pressure catches while fielding on the Worlds biggest cricket stage . Head went on to take full control of the game by hitting 137 runs off 120 balls . Many fans will debate was it the Sharma catch or Head's batting exploits that won the final . Maybe best left at it was both that catch and his outstanding batting . Head was so humble in telling reporters "Not in my wildest dreams did I think I'd be here," "To imagine getting a hundred in a World Cup final, not knowing if I was going to be here, it's crazy "

As captain, he took a massive risk to win the toss and field first, but the bowlers and fielders backed him up and full marks to them. The quicks lifted in the semi and final, while Adam Zampa was brilliant with his leg-break, David Warner great with the bat and superb in the field.

As for the Shield side it was disappointing for them to lose in Western Australia, but the simple fact was they didn't make enough runs. Tuesday sees them take on Victoria at Adelaide Oval. They must win this game. If they can go into the BBL break at three wins and three losses they're still in the hunt to make the final, if they lose or draw two wins at the break leaves them having a lot to do post Christmas. The batsmen have got to lift. The bowling has been excellent and fingers crossed they can get the job done and beat the Mexicans from across the border.
