Rosehill Racetrack Bombshell to Put It Mildly !!!

News that the home of the Golden Slipper being Rosehill Racetrack soon to be lost has totally flabber-gastered many Aussie sporting and racing fans. The breaking news of future plans will see the entire site be developed into housing with racing events to cease at the track within the next five years . With the news that negotiations were taking place between the Australian Turf Club (ATC) and NSW Government that up to 25,000 homes will be built on the current Racetrack land in the west of Sydney. The Test summer kicks off next Thursday in Perth and Australia are well placed to have another strong season at home, with three Tests v Pakistan and two against a weak West Indies. It'll be another opportunity for local lads Travis Head and Alex Carey to enhance their reputations as Test players. Head now seems rock solid in his Test spot, but with Josh Inglis breathing down the throat of Carey, he will need to be at his best to maintain his spot in the side.

Clearly the Bairstow incident at Lord's has caused Carey some stress, but it is now sixth months ago and one hopes he has put it well and truly behind him.

The bouncy Perth Stadium pitch will cause the Pakistan batsmen some issues, but it was encouraging to see their new skipper Shan Masood peel off a double ton in Canberra in the tour match. Babar Azam is a champion player and with left-arm quick Shaheen Shah Afridi a top liner, they'll press Australia at times in the series. Whether the rest of their side can cope with the Aussie conditions remains to be seen. The pitches at several venues in recent seasons have been more in favour of the pace bowlers, so their lack of an experienced spinner may not matter too much.

Domestic cricket changed formats as BBL13 kicks off, the Strikers taking on the Heat Saturday night at Adelaide Oval. They've lost Rashid Khan which is a blow, but left-arm quick David Payne from Gloucester and Surrey (Eng) all-rounder Jamie Overton will more than replace him. Matt Short is the new skipper and being fresh back from India, will be keen to impress. Runs was a problem for the Strikers last season, so some of the batsmen are going to have to stand up and be counted.

With a 40 match fixture instead of 56, the format is shorter and will keep players and fans alike fresher. Hopefully if the weather holds on Saturday night, the Strikers can do the business!
