parents Peter and Helen Jolly, Peter also announced that he has finally decided to retire the evergreen galloper Morvada. There is bound to be more of the Sghirripa story in due course but not many will know that regular track rider Lauren Stojakovic will have a better guide than most as she won the Group 1 2013 Blue Diamond Stakes aboard Miracles Of Life. While talking about Blue Diamonds there will be plenty of eyes on the unraced Kuroyanagi in the first at the Gawler on the Gawler Bung Fritz Cup Day tomorrow. Kuroyanagi is reported to be on track for the 2024 Blue Diamond and is named after the famous Japanese actress Tetsuko Kuroyanagi. The filly has a strong female pedigree
