There Are A Million Wagering Rules— Handy To Know Some

Refund of investment-fixed odds-jockeys' challenge (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), all fixed odds investments made on selections for a jockeys' challenge are made on a play and pay basis.

(2) If a licence operator accepts an investment on a selection for a jockeys' challenge after a jockey that is part of the selection withdraws from the challenge, the licence operator must refund the investment in full.

3) Also, a licence operator must refund in full all investments received on selections for a jockeys' challenge, if- (a) the jockeys' challenge is postponed or cancelled before it starts; or (b) at least 1 horse race in the jockeys' challenge is cancelled and at the conclusion of the challenge- (i) the leading jockey does not hold an unassailable lead; or (ii) if there is more than 1 leading jockey-the leading jockeys do not hold an unassailable lead.

Refund of investment-fixed odds-soccer A licence operator must refund in full an investment made on a soccer match if- (a) the entity controlling the match calls off the match before it is complete; and (b) the entity controlling the match does not declare a result for the match; and (c) the investment has not been decided before the match is called off. 2) A licence operator must refund in full an investment made on a soccer match if- (a) the entity controlling the match calls off the match before it is complete; and (b) the entity controlling the match declares a result for the match; and (c) the selection relates to the number of goals scored in the match.

Result of event-cricket (1) A player in a cricket match who retires for a reason other than illness or injury is taken to be out when the player retires. (2) A mankad dismissal is taken not to be a dismissal by a bowler. (3) For deciding the result of wagering on the performance of a player or team over a series of matches, if a match in the series is abandoned, the performance of the player or team in the abandoned match is included for deciding the player's or team's performance over the series.

Refund of investment-fixed odds-cricket (1) A licence operator must refund in full an investment made on any cricket match if- (a) the match is abandoned before a ball is bowled; or (b) for next batsman out wagering- (i) the batting partnership involving the batsman on whom the investment is made is unbroken at the end of the relevant innings; or (ii) the batsman on whom the investment is made retires injured and does not resume batting in the innings; or (c) for head-to-head wagering on the number of runs scored, if either of the relevant batsman for the investment is not at the wicket when at least 1 ball is bowled. (2) For subsection (1)(c), it is irrelevant whether or not the batsman faces a ball.

That was Dubai Moon's 3rd victory in the space of week after winning at Hanging Rock by 8 lengths on Boxing Day , then saluting at Moe the very next day.

What a week of Test Cricket that was! No matter how little help the ICC gives it, the longest form of the game still delivers the most magnificent outcomes, with the West Indies and England both producing amazing wins away from home. Looking at the match at the Gabba, West Indies were 5-64 at the first break, but had turned the game around to such an extent that 24 hours later, they had 311 on the board and Australia was 4-24! Heading into the final day, Australia chasing 216 to win, was well on their way to victory at 2-113, before collapsing to Shamar Joseph who took 7-68 after the night before he hobbled off the ground, with what looked to be a broken right big toe. The little known quick got faster the longer he bowled and he gained the Windies their first win in Australia since February 1997.

In Hyderabad, England trailed by 190 on first innings and when Ben Stokes was dismissed at 5-163 in the second dig, looked set for a big defeat. But thanks to an incredible knock by Ollie Pope of 196, they reached 420 and set India 231 to win. The Indians were nervous about the chase on a wearing pitch and then up sprung debutant Tom Hartley who having been carted for 2-131 off 25 overs in the first dig, took 7-62 to bowl India out and grab England a 28-run win.

You could not imagine two more amazing Tests in the one year, let alone across the course of the same week, finishing on the same day! It goes to show how great Test Cricket can be, any team can come from any position to win and while the Windies series is over, may the uncertainty continue in the four remaining Tests in India.

The ODI series starts in Melbourne on Friday, exclusive to FOX and KAYO and hopefully the Windies can continue their form from December when they beat the Poms in the Caribbean. There are a few new faces in their lineup, which is led by Shai Hope who has over 5000 ODI runs at 50 plus.

The Shield gets back going at the Junction Oval in Melbourne on Saturday, when the Redbacks take on the Vics. Neither Alex Carey nor Spencer Johnson will be there for that game but have both told me they will be available for the next round when they take on Queensland at Adelaide Oval on February 16. The Junction Oval has been flat as a pancake this season, so hopefully somehow SA can conjur up a result to keep their hopes of making the final on March 21 alive.
