In the USA this year's Super Bowl LVIII is being played this year between the Kansas City Chiefs and the San Francisco 49 ers. This NFL game will be held at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas, Nevada and is considered the Golden Hour for America's highest executive advertisers when for 4 hours something like tens of millions \$\$\$\$ is spent to gain direct air play . CBS charges \$6.5 million to \$7 million for a 30-second commercial, Then there is the half time entertainment , this year to be performed by Usher . With the season on the line, the Redbacks trip to Victoria this past week was disappointing as they went down by three wickets in both the Shield and Marsh Cup games at the Junction Oval. On a challenging deck they made just 173 and when the Vics ended day one on 0-71, they looked set to cop a hiding. The Redbacks bowlers got their act together on day two, to keep Victoria to 288, Liam Scott taking 4-18 in an encouraging performance.

Batting a second time around SA reached 2-118 where things looked promising, but an eventual total of 271 only set the Vics 157 to win.

The bowlers cracked in again, as they have all season, and at 5-73 and 6-101 were a chance, but Sam Harper smacked a quick 34 to take the game away for the hosts, who ended up with the win.

One player that did have a strong week in Melbourne was keeper Harry Nielsen, who made scores of 45 and 67 in the Shield and 61 in the one-dayer. Unfortunately the batting this season has again been the Achilles heel, with only Nathan McSweeney (39.38), Ben Manenti (38.27) and Nielsen (32.00) averaging above 30. Henry Hunt made 54 in the second dig in Melbourne but is averaging 25.35, while Jake Lehmann (37 & 11 v Vic) has 255 runs at 18.21 which is well short of what he would be hoping for. Jake Winter batted at three in the one-dayer and made 24, it will be interesting to see if he gets a run in the XI when SA takes on Queensland in the Shield next Friday at Adelaide Oval, in their last home game for the season.

Tonight in Hobart sees the first of the T20s against the West Indies. With the injection of Andre Russell, Jason Holder and Nicholas Pooran, they will be more competitive than they were in the ODIs. David Warner returns to the Australian lineup to play his 100th match, which will be led by Mitch Marsh. In the head, West Indies actually leads 10-9 and beat Australia 4-1 when the teams met in the Caribbean in 2021. Hobart is a batting friendly surface so the ball might fly around a bit tonight in what hopefully will be a good contest.
