

India will be without skipper Rohit Sharma and with Shubman Gill busting his thumb whilst fielding in the practice game, they will miss their number three batsman badly. Young gun opener Yashasvi Jaiswal will have to carry the can, he had trouble with the left-arm quick Berger in South Africa earlier in the year (he got him out three out of four innings) so will need to learn quickly how to bat well on what should be a fast bouncy pitch. Virat Kohli has averaged only 33 in the last four years of Tests so the challenge will be there for him. India boasts a strong pace attack who will enjoy the Perth conditions, but having not bowled a lot in the recent Tests at home to New Zealand, will they be able to come back and perform well if they need to bowl third and fourth spells in a day?

Australia would be a little worried about their batting, but playing at home and at Perth Stadium (where they are four from four in Tests) is a big advantage, almost bigger than playing at the Gabba first up for all those years. Nathan McSweeney has a tight technique and has shown fine form this summer, hopefully he has the ability to make runs at Test level. Travis Head has had a good layoff and will be refreshed, but will need to be careful slashing outside off as third man is a place he has been caught a lot at the WACA and Perth Stadium over the years.

The Aussie pace attack picks itself, while Mitchell Starc is getting on a bit, he bowled very well in the recent Shield match at the MCG. Pat Cummins is still going well and I'd expect Josh Hazlewood to right up to the peak of his powers. Off-spinner Nathan Lyon loves bowling at Perth Stadium, where he has 27 wickets for an 18 average.

The series should be great to watch, India have won the last two in Australia, but this one will be tough without some key players out early on. I think Australia will win the Test and series 3-1, or maybe 4-1 if it doesn't rain in Sydney!
