

A terrific Border/Gavaskar Test series is over and the better side in Australia won. One could argue that if Jasprit Bumrah had been fit to bowl, India may have levelled the series in Sydney, but in the end, Australia's batsmen made centuries when they were needed, took the catches when they came and were superior in bowling.

Australia's bowling lineup were overall more consistent and stronger than India's with Pat Cummins, Mitchell Starc and Scott Boland all dominant figures at various stages. India only had Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj, their spinners were largely ineffectual as was the output of their third seam option. In the period when Bumrah couldn't bowl, Australia's batting, led by Travis Head took control as Australia eventually went ahead in the series.

Australia nullified Virat Kohli in the last four Tests, when he averaged just 12. I doubt he will play another Test in our country. Rohit Sharma's Test career could well be over given he has averaged 10 in his last 15 innings and just six in the series. He looked cooked and off-spinner R Ashwin retired – three massive names who all under performed in the series.

For Australia, Head of course was great in Adelaide and Brisbane, Smith made two tough, hard fought 100s and Marnus Labuschagne kept his career alive with two gutsy 70s at the MCG. While Usman Khawaja batted well in the last two Tests, I find it hard to believe that he will face England in the Ashes next summer. With a two-Test tour of Sri Lanka up in a few weeks and a three-Test tour to the Windies to come mid-year, he'll need to find some 100s to keep his spot. Beau Webster impressed and now looks like he'll get a run at number six – and can he take a catch!

Finally, what about the crowds! The people turned out in massive numbers and the TV ratings have been enormous. Next year's Ashes will be superb and even better in Adelaide with a day-Test, which hopefully ensure we'll get at least a four-day match in the sunshine.

PRAIRIE FLOWER was slow away last start and did a good job to go down narrowly to Vintage Star in town when resuming. Selections: 4 from 5 **Race 3**: is a strong maiden NOETZIE was well supported first up and made good ground from back in the field to finish fourth. Victorian visitor THE STREAKER from the Clayton Douglas year looked unlucky last start and should improve. Selections: 4 from 7

**Race 4**: RUSSIAN DANCER from the Stokes yard steps up to the 1800 metres and fourth up should be the main chance in a hard race. Expect improvement from MAGNETIC EDGE Selections; 1 to beat 6 **Race 5**: Victorian visitor RUMINATE has been racing in terrific form and will only carry 58kg after Matthew Chadwick's claim. RABTAT chased home Morris Minor this route last week and drops 4kg Selections 1 from 3

**Race 6**: Starts the Quaddie and the Stokes trained STARTIDE impressed winning at headquarters back in November, then was slow away here last start. SIOUX WARRIOR is at double figures today and gets Manoel Nunes has to be a danger.Selections 8 to win from 9 **Race 7**: COMMISSIONS steps up to 2000m after leading throughout to score over 1500m at Gawler, COURS VITE drops back 500 metres from his last start and may need further but is a chance in this. Selections 3 to beat 4.

**Race 8**: I'm tipping the Stokes yard to have a good day at "the Bridge" RUNAWAY STATEMENT won here three weeks ago and should be the one to beat again. EROICA will improve second up and gets a tongue tie added today. Selections: 7 to win from 13 **Race 9**: THE MANSMAN went into our black book after finishing just behind the placegetters last month. Should appreciate the extra distance of the 1400m on Saturday he also wears a tongue tie for the first time. OUTTA COMPTON charged home from back in the field to finish second to Angelic Appeal this route. Selections: 11 to beat 1.

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
