

Race 2: DIVINE FIRE a winner of three of her past four starts. If she can get an easy lead, she will be the one to beat. STRUCK BY drops in grade after finishing a close third behind Dubai Poet in the Xmas Handicap and gets Taylor Johnstone's claim to help. Selections 5 to win from 2

Race 3: is a maiden NOVELA finished fourth last start, blinkers go on for the first time Saturday, which may help in a hard race. Selection; 6 in a hard race.

Race 4: GOTTA GO GURU was a big winner last start. This doesn't look any harder and she'll carry 1/2kg less today. COURS VITA is back in trip after running second to Arugamama over 2500m last month. Selections: 7 from 8

Race 5: QUANAH returns with a new trainer who looks a smart type, the only concern is hasn't seen a good surface before as both wins came on a heavy track. CHAMBERS BAY will probably need further but has raced well when fresh in the past Selections: 7 to win from 3.

Race 6: ROYAL TRAPEZE has won his past two starts. He's up in class today but drops 2.5kg. HOLMES will be at his best when he gets over further, but you can expect to see him doing his best work late in the race. Selections: 2 from 1.

Race 7: STAR SIRIUS finished a close second to Anotherhouse at Morphettville at her third run back from a break. She meets the Anotherhouse 1.5kg better at the weights on Saturday. FINE FUTURE has won this over this trip in the past. Selections: 3 from 2

Race 8: DUCHESS OF SUSSEX from the Stokes yard was spelled following a luckless run on the Parks track in September. Has claims in this. HAMNER SPRINGS comes into this off the back of an Oakbank trial win on January 3rd. Selections: 7 & 5

Race 9: SWYCHO is coming off a let-up and comes back in distance but is quite smart and can send us home a winner. HIGH ON SUGAR will push forward and give them something to catch. He was run down close to the line here a fortnight ago. Selections: 6 from 5.
