

Australia faces Sri Lanka in the first Test on Wednesday and the good news for the touring squad is that left-arm orthodox spinner Matt Kuhnemann will be there, after dislocating his thumb in the Big Bash a few weeks ago. He was passed fit to go yesterday and given the nature of the pitches over there, will almost be a certain starter for the First Test. He performed well in India in 2023 where he took nine wickets, including 5-16 in the Third Test at Indore, which Australia won and will do well there.

So with spinners Nathan Lyon, Matt Kuhnemann and Todd Murphy all available, it will be fascinating to see how the final XI shapes up for the Aussies next week. Conditions are likely to going with extra spin options, I wonder if they might go for Lyon and Kuhnemann, plus Mitchell Starc and Scott Boland with Beau Webster there to both seamers and off-spin. Playing Murphy instead of Boland would be a risk even if the pitch looks like it will be a raging turner.

There's plenty of talk about Travis Head opening with Sam Konstas, whilst leaving Usman Khawaja out. The side does need some renewal and with Khawaja now 38 years of age it may be the chance to make a change. Young left -hand batsman Cooper Connolly may get a chance as well, while Nathan McSweeney ideally could slot into the team as well, having played three Tests this summer versus India.

Sri Lanka will be hard to beat at home, having come off a two-nil series win over New Zealand back in September. Batting wise they have an in-form Kamindu Mendis who averaged 74 in 2024, the experienced Dinesh Chandimal and Angelo Matthews, plus left-arm spinner Prabath Jayasuriya who snared 48 Test wickets last year and 12 and 14.75 when the teams last met in Sri Lanka in 2022.

Tests on spinning decks are always fascinating to watch, and with two Tests over there, the World Test Final in June versus South Africa at Lord's and the three-Test tour in the West Indies during June/July, there is a heap of Test cricket to look forward to over the next six months.

Race 8: TAUNTING had a tough run at Caulfield first up and wasn't disgraced in finishing fourth. Remains unbeaten second up. GOLDRUSH GURU is first up since winning the Victorian Derby. Selections: 1 is a nice race from 11.

Race 9: CLARENCE has changed stables from David Jolly to Clarken/O'Shea stable and showed good ability when last in work. KALASEC finished second at Murray Bridge when resuming. # 9 from 6.

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
